Meaning of terms used in this guide

A-Level	Advanced Secondary School Level
O-Level	Ordinary Secondary School Level
PC	 A private candidate is a person who registered for A-Level National Examinations but is not enrolled for full-time education in a secondary school. A private candidate may be coached by specialized centres or him/her self-coached.
PCRD	Private Candidate Registration Districts: These are designated districts where potential private candidates must register online and sit for Advanced Level and TVET National Examinations.
PCEC	Private Candidate Examination Centers: These are designated locations where registered private candidates sit for A-level and TVET National Examinations.
PCIN	Private Candidate Index Number: it is a unique number given to a registered private candidate to identify him/her during the examination period. It also appears on the examination result slip/Certificate issued to the candidate.
TTC	Teacher Training College
TVET	Technical and Vocational Education Training



Section A: Introduction

These guidelines are intended to guide eligible private candidates who wish to register and sit for A-Level National Examinations.

Section B: Conditions of eligibility to register as a private candidate

The following are the conditions for eligibility to register as a private candidate:

- **1.** A person who previously sat for A-Level National Examinations in Rwanda (or equivalent in other countries).
 - **Note:** Official national certificates from outside Rwanda must be accompanied by a confirmation letter from the former school that the candidate attended and another from the national body responsible for national examinations which gave out the certificate.
- 2. A person who sat for O-Level National Examinations (or the equivalent in other countries) and did not enter or complete A-Level. Potential candidates should at least have finished Ordinary Level five years ago i.e. before 2018.
- 3. A person who completed S3 (or equivalent) before the year 2000 when Ordinary Level National Exams were not administered in the Rwandan education system.
- 4. A person with a qualification obtained in Rwanda in the past, including:
 - A3, A4, D4, D5
 - ENI (Ecole Normale Inférieure)
 - EMP (Ecole Moyenne Pédagogique)
 - EMM (Ecole Ménagère Moyenne)
 - EAP (Ecole d'Apprentissage Pédagogique)
 - EMA (Ecole de Moniteur Auxiliaire)
 - ENA (Ecole Normale Auxiliaire)
 - ENTA (Ecole Normale Technique Auxiliaire)
 - Section Familiale
 - CERAR (Centre d'Education Rurale et Artisanale au Rwanda)
 - CERAI (Centre d'Education Rurale et Artisanale Intégrée)
- 5. Eligible candidates to register for TTC National Examinations as private candidates are <u>only</u> those who have obtained a secondary school certificate in teacher education (provided by TTCs). However, graduates from "Normale Primaire", "Humanités Pédagogiques" or <u>equivalent are also eligible</u>. This implies that those candidates either failed or want to improve on their previous performance.

TTC private candidates must register in a TTC school of their choice, where they will undergo intensive pedagogical training, carry out internship and be rigorously prepared to face final teaching practical examinations.



6. Eligible **candidates for TVET level 5** are:

- a) Individuals who graduated from TVET schools in previous years and want to improve on their results.
- b) Individuals who sat for O-Level National Examinations (or equivalent in other countries) but did not enter or complete A-Level. Potential candidates should at least have finished Ordinary Level five years ago.

Section C: Requirements for registration as a private candidate

In the registration process, a private candidate should upload into the system:

- 1. A valid copy of the National Identity Card
- 2. Original copies of certificates, result slips, etc. proving completion of the education levels mentioned in Section B.
- 3. **A coloured passport-size photo** with not more than 200kb, with a white background and clearly showing both ears.
- 4. All those required documents shall be scanned as original copies and uploaded online.

Section D: Private candidates' registration fees

- 1. A private candidate <u>MUST</u> pay a non-refundable registration fee amounting to <u>15,000 frw</u>.
- 2. Payment of the registration fee <u>MUST BE DONE ONLY AFTER</u> the candidate has been issued a bill number and a pin number from Irembo Services. This bill number expires after 5 days. Private candidates are therefore requested to carefully assess their eligibility conditions before proceeding with registration.

Section E: Registration process

- 1. A candidate <u>MUST</u> register online. Registration is done through: <u>www.sdms.gov.rw</u>, by following the instructions provided online (see registration process on attachment).
- 2. There are currently thirteen (13) Private Candidates' Registration Districts (PCRD) in the whole country. Those Districts and their codes are indicated in the table below.
- 3. To register, a Private Candidate will choose one district where she/he will sit for examinations.

- 4. Upon registration, a Private Candidate is issued with a unique identification number referred to as "Private Candidate's Index Number (PCIN)". This is comprised of (1) <u>the district code</u> (the district where the candidate registers); (2) <u>letters: PC</u> (denoting: Private Candidate), (3) <u>Abbreviation of the subject combination, option or trade</u> (e.g. PCB, for Physics, Chemistry, Biology or ECLPE for Early Childhood and Lower Primary Education), (4) <u>a three-digit number</u> (the <u>candidate's individual number</u>) and (5) <u>the four-digit year</u>. Example of a full Private Candidate Index Number: 12PCPCB0052023
- 5. Private candidates who register through TTCs remain with the status of "Private Candidates". Therefore, they must have their specific index numbers. No private candidate is allowed to register under index numbers similar to regular students' (see the example of PCIN in Section E.4 above).
- 6. Information about Private Candidates' Examination Centers (PCEC) can be obtained from the District Director of Education (DDE) office at the District headquarters.
- 7. Candidates <u>MUST</u> sit for A-Level National Examinations at the Private Candidates Examination Centre where they registered.
- 8. Apart from TTC private candidates, no Private Candidate from general and TVET education can register at a school. Any A-Level or TVET PC who registers at a school will have his/her candidature cancelled.



Section F: Registration dates

Registration of A-Level and TVET Private Candidates for National Examinations will be done online from 01/04/2023 to 15/05/2023

Section G: General information

- 1. Science practical and Technical practical examinations for general education and TVET: Information regarding science practical examinations (Physics, Chemistry & Biology) and other details will be communicated to candidates two months before sitting for examinations.
- 2. **Reserving (carrying forward) of grades** obtained from previous A-Level National Examinations **is not permitted**. A candidate who intends to repeat A-Level National examinations **MUST repeat all subjects** in the subject combination and must not change their subject combination, option or trade.
- 3. **Examination misconduct**: Every candidate is expected to respect all rules and regulations governing National Examinations. Failure to comply with them will result in punishment according to the law, rules and regulations governing National Examinations in Rwanda, which will be provided to candidates separately.
- 4. Any candidate who registers using forged documents, will be **REJECTED** when it is discovered that he/she was not eligible to register as a Private Candidate. She /He shall also be pursued for criminal offence by competent organs.
- 5. **Identification documents to bring at the examinations centre:** A registered Private Candidate MUST bring with him/her a printed registration form (issued by NESA) and a valid National Identity Card on all his/her examination days.
- 6. **Examination Calendar:** Timetables for National Examinations will be available to view, print, or download from NESA or MINEDUC's website three months before the candidates' sitting for examinations. The timetable will also be posted on NESA website and made available at schools, for those without access to internet.
- 7. Subject combinations for which National Examinations will be done in General Education in 2023 are:

- 8. In addition to the above-mentioned combination subjects, all the candidates in General Education will take compulsory exams of (a) General Studies and Communication Skills and (b) Entrepreneurship. Thus, each candidate will sit for five subject exams.
- 9. Any candidate who misses one or more subject examinations does not qualify for certification.
- 10. The following are the examinable options across TTCs for private candidates.




STEP ONE:

Step two:


Click on **REGISTER NOW**






Step Three:

Fill in the provided form, upload a photo and click on NEXT




Step Four:

Click on CREATE NEW and fill in your academic details




Having filled in academic detail and uploaded the required documents, click on save and go to FINISH






Step Five:
